Chairman Jeffery Schielke called the meeting to order at 9:35 am, Heidi Lichtenberger called the role.

II. Approval of August 19, 2022 Meeting Minutes

Tony Speciale made a motion to approve the meeting minutes, John Skillman seconded, and the meetings minutes passed unanimously.

III. **Public Comments**

No public comments were received.

IV. **Action Items**

A. Adoption of the FFY2023-2027 Council STP Active and Contingency Program

Mike Millette explained the process of approvals to-date and requested adoption. Tony Speciale made a motion to adopt the programs, John Skillman seconded, and the adoption passed.

A. Council Director's Report

Upcoming Meetings

The next KKCOM Transportation Policy Committee meeting will take place on **January 19 at 1:00**.

The next KKCOM Bike Ped Committee meeting will take place early 2023.

Funding Available for EV Fast Charging

Through the Driving a Cleaner Illinois Program, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency is accepting applications to install new commercial grade direct current fast charging for light-duty electric vehicles, supported by the Volkswagen settlement fund. Applications close Friday, December 30.

Important Reminder Regarding 2023 CMAQ, TAP-L, and STP-SF Call For Projects

In order to be eligible to apply for CMAQ, TAP-L, and STP-SF funding in the upcoming Call for Projects in January 2023, Phase I Engineering must be underway as defined by CMAP in the application booklet. Projects that are further along in the Phase 1 process will be allowed to apply for funding for phases outside of construction and may request cost increases. Staff will share the definitions and funding stipulations once the final application booklet is available. The application deadline in March 2023.

Kane County Bike Plan Update

Staff and consultants from Epstein and WSP have concluded the first phase of community engagement for the plan update. We received over 1,000 responses to the online survey and several people also sent in comments via email. Staff is scheduling meetings with various stakeholder groups including local governments, bicycle and pedestrian-focused commissions, and bicycle and pedestrian advocate groups. A second phase of community outreach will commence in the spring along with another survey.

Fox Valley Bike Share Program

Kane County advertised an RFP for the 2023 Fox Valley Bike Share program as the current agreement with Koloni is expiring at the end of this year. Unfortunately, the County did not receive any proposals by the due date of August 5th. Staff is working with the Purchasing Department to determine the next steps. Staff is reaching out to communities that currently have a bike share program to request their vendor contact information and will follow up to see if they had feedback on the RFP.

ON TO 2050 Plan Update Approval

On October 12, 2022 the CMAP Board and MPO Policy Committee adopted an update to ON TO 2050, the region's long-range plan. A summary about the update can be found on the <u>CMAP website</u>.

Greenhouse Gas Emissions Inventory and Local Summaries

CMAP's newly updated greenhouse gas emissions inventory shows that between 2010 and 2019, overall greenhouse gas emissions in northeastern Illinois decreased by 9 percent. While this is progress, the region has a shared goal of reducing emissions by 5 percent annually through 2050, and it fell 36 percent short of the goal. For the first time, CMAP produced individualized data summaries by county, community, and Chicago neighborhood that provide a snapshot of emissions from the building, transportation, and waste sectors. Local governments, sustainability committees, and others are encouraged to use this data to develop local climate action plans.

Video: How CMAP's New Accessibility Program Can Help Your Community

CMAP's new program helps communities in the region improve accessibility and comply with the ADA. In a short <u>video</u>, Linda Mastandrea, director of regional ADA planning and local safety at CMAP, provides an overview of the program, what's required in the ADA, and how CMAP can help. Learn more on their <u>resource page</u>.

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Information

CMAP continues to update an <u>online resource</u> providing communities and partners with the essential information they need to know about IIJA and its benefits to the region. This includes funding estimates for existing transportation programs as well as new programs that can make the regional transportation system stronger and more resilient for the next generation of users.

B. Council Chair and Vice Chair Nominating Committee

Jackie explained that in the odd-numbered years, a nominating committee will be formed to select a Chair and Vice Chair for KKCOM. A nominating committee will meet before the next Full Council meeting to discuss potential candidates and will present their slate at that meeting.

C. Council of Mayors Executive Committee Report

Mayor Schielke presented this report. The Council of Mayors Executive Committee met in September where they received updates from CMAP, STP Selection Committee, and IDOT's Bureau of Local Roads. CMAP presented their Making it Better Plan which pertains to ADA. Next, the RTA presented their Strategic Plan for 2023. CMAP's Legislative Affairs team presented an overview of CMAP's federal and state focus to align with core areas and leverage new opportunities available with the IIJA. The next meeting will be in January 2023.

D. IDOT Local Roads Update

Marilin Solomon presented IDOT's Local Roads update. Based on the status sheets, projects in Aurora, Batavia, and Elgin require updates. Lastly, the 2022 Contractor Performance Evaluations are due February 6, 2023.

E. CMAP Report

Kama Dobbs presented the CMAP Report. She went over the upcoming scheduled ADA training events. On November 3rd, the STP Selection Committee approved the Application Booklet for the upcoming Shared Fund CFP. The Shared Fund CFP will again be held in conjunction with CMAQ and TAP projects and will open on January 17th and close on March 10th with a soft deadline of February 24th if an applicant would like their application reviewed by a PL. Staff presented proposed changes of the Active Program Management policies to the STP Selection Committee.

Kama pointed out a change in the program development schedule which is to move it up by four months so

that the MPO Policy Committee can approve new projects in June, rather than October. With the federal fiscal year ending at about the same time, it has caused some issues with TIP changes and obligation deadlines. Lastly, IDOT is accepting applications for Illinois' Competitive Freight Program with applications due December 19th.

F. Transportation Improvement Program Update

- IDOT Program Report District 1: no update
- IDOT Program Report District 3: no update
- Illinois State Toll Highway Authority Report: Kelsey Passi presented this update. For the 2023 budget, they held a public comment period and the Board is expected to approve in December \$1.55 billion of revenue to support a spending plan that includes \$426.5 million for annual maintenance and operations on their mile system. The budget will also fund \$1.47 billion in capital spending. Kelsey also discussed the Move Over Law which requires drivers to slow down and safely change lanes when a vehicle is on the side of the road with flashing hazard lights. Accidents are up 30% from last year. Drivers can be fined up to \$10,000 and a two year suspension of driving privileges. Lastly, she mentioned that some construction projects will continue into the winter, weather permitting.
- RTA Report: Anthony Cefali presented the RTA report. The RTA is in the middle of their budget season and currently at the public comment stage. The Strategic Plan will be released on Monday and open for public comment through February. The open house / kick-off meeting will be virtual.
- Metra Report: Demetri Skoufis presented the Metra Report. They released the proposed 2023 Program and Budget for public comment. No service reductions or fare increases are proposed. Federal Covid relief funds have been utilized and they have enough set aside to last through 2025. Metra is working to figure out how to operate without the federal funds. The Board met in November and passed the budget, which is 8.9% higher than last year due to inflation, salary increases, fuel, and bringing service back. On December 5th, the UP West line will increase from 40 to 58 trains per day, 9 additional in-bound and 9 additional outbound. Ridership is still around 50% and anticipating 55% ridership by the end of 2023. Metra is installing ticket vending machines at their stations which will eliminate cash transactions on the train with the conductors.
- Pace Report: Martin Sandoval from Pace reported that the balanced budget is at \$303.4 million and the ADA paratransit operating budget is at \$238.5 million. Pace is working to eliminate transfer costs and reduce packaged passes. Pace Route 534 (Naperville Kane County) will be discontinued due to low ridership. Additionally, Pace is updating their phone app.
- Kane County Report: Mike Zakosek reported on behalf of Kane County. The Fabyan at RT 31 intersection improvement planning and environmental linkage study is nearing completion with a goal to move into Phase 1 in the coming months. The Randall Road North Multi-Modal project has begun Phase 1. For the Orchard Road at U.S. 30 project, paving is near completion. Bliss/Main/Fabyan let and construction began. Lastly, the county published a contract for bidders for Longmeadow Parkway to have contaminated soil removed, work to begin in March.
- **Kendall County Report:** Fran Klaas had nothing to report.
- Municipal Reports: Erin Willrett from the City of Yorkville spoke about CMAP's ONTO 2050 report, specifically the population forecast because it does impact the region.

VI. Other Business

A. Discussion of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT): Mayor Schielke spoke about the increase in electric cars affecting MFT and that it needs to be addressed. We should expect to hear more in the coming months and years.

VII. Announcements

Tony Speciale from Sugar Grove announced this was his last meeting since he is retiring. Jackie shared that the Eldamain Bridge in Kendall County has been named the Francis C. Klaas Bridge in honor of Fran's longtime service to the community. Lastly, The Batavia City Council unanimously approved renaming the Batavia Municipal Government Center the Jeffery D. Schielke Government Center.

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


This route is indicated as SRA WK001 - Wikaduke Trail on the current CMAP Strategic Regional Arterial Sytem map. One of the primary improvements to complete the connectivity of the Wikaduke Trail is pending improvements at the intersection of Eola Road and US 30. In 2019 the City of Aurora realigned the north leg of this intersection to provide a safer intersection alignment and installed traffic signals at US 30 in accordance with SRA design criteria. The Village of Plainfield's 2022 Transportation and Mobility Plan indicates proposed improvements to the south leg of this intersection and connection to Ridge Road completing the corridor connectivity of the Wikaduke Trail SRA Route from Interstate 80 to IL 38 (SRA 506). This section of Eola Road is the only section of the Wikaduke Trail corridor that is currently designated a local road or street, all other portions are classified as major collector or minor arterial.



The Kane Kendall Council of Mayors receives federal transportation planning funds to perform various planning and programming activities for Kane County and Kendall County. The Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) directs these funds to the Kane County Division of Transportation so that Kane County may continue to provide transportation planning staff to the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors for regional coordination and planning activities.

Primary staff for the Council of Mayors includes: Jacqueline Forbes – Executive Director Heidi Lichtenberger – Council Director Kaci Crowley - Regional Planning Liaison, Bike/Ped Coordinator

KKCOM regional planning staff facilitates strategic participation by local officials in the region's transportation process as required by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and the Regional Planning Act. Staff also supports the Council of Mayors by providing STP and CMAQ program development and monitoring, general liaison services, technical assistance and communications assistance.

An agreement will be executed with the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning for the FY2024 Planning Liaison Scope of Services. It is anticipated that Kane Kendall Council of Mayors will receive total federal funding of \$185,862.37. The local match is paid by Kane County Division of Transportation in the amount of \$46,465.59.

Staff recommends Council approval authorizing the Council Chairman to execute a resolution re-allocating the Fiscal Year 2024 Federal Transportation Planning Funds to the Kane County Division of Transportation to provide Professional Staff Assistance to the Kane Kendall Council of Mayors.

Funding Opportunities/Announcements

2023-2024 Federal Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant

The U.S. DOT published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) as part of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to strategically deploy electric vehicle (EV) charging infrastructure and other alternative fueling infrastructure projects in urban and rural communities in publicly accessible locations, including downtown areas and local neighborhoods, particularly in underserved and disadvantaged communities. The Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Discretionary Grant Program (CFI Program) investments will make modern and sustainable infrastructure accessible to all drivers of electric, hydrogen, propane, and natural gas vehicles. This program provides two funding categories of grants: (1) Community Charging and Fueling Grants (Community Program); and (2) Alternative Fuel Corridor Grants (Corridor Program). Additional resources and an informational webinar are available. Applications are due May 30.

Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Discretionary Grant Program

Under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), the USDOT announced that the (SS4A) <u>Program</u> will appropriate \$5 billion over five years to assist with ensuring safe streets and roads for all, and to address the national roadway safety crisis. This program provides two funding categories of grants: (1) Planning and Demonstration Grants; and (2) Implementation Grants. Last year Illinois was awarded six planning grants. There will be three webinars available on three different topics. Applications are due July 10.

IDOT Invites Applications for \$2.5 Million in Transit Grants

IDOT is now accepting applications for a competitive grant program that aims to expand safe, equitable access to public transportation throughout the state. Selected projects will feature transit opportunities while furthering the goals of **IDOT's Illinois** Long-Range Transportation Plan. The grants will fund studies on planning and preliminary engineering issues regarding public multimodal, intermodal and nonmotorized transportation. Governmental entities such as counties, metropolitan planning agencies, municipalities, state agencies, public transit agencies and state universities are urged to apply. An informational webinar to explain the grant program and provide assistance to prospective applicants will be held on April 18 at 10 a.m. via WebEx. For additional details, visit 2023 IDOT Transit Planning NOFO.pdf (illinois.gov). Applications are due by 5 pm on May 24.

Surface Transportation Program

Revised Active Program Management Policies

On February 9, 2023, the CMAP STP Project Selection Committee adopted revised Active Program Management Policies for projects funded with the STP Shared Fund and/or STP-Local funds, effective immediately. IDOT Updates

Fiscal Year 2024 Federal Funding Allotments

<u>Circular Letter 2023-02</u> announced the Fiscal Year 2024 funding allotments for the following programs; STP-Rural, STP-Urban, Local Bridge Formula Program (LBFP-formally STP-Br), and State Matching Assistance. Allotment amounts are listed in the Circular Letter.

Salary Cap Increase for Engineering Agreements

The salary cap for Engineering Agreements has increased from \$78/hour to \$86/ hour, according to Circular Letter 2023-06; effective February 7, 2023, with updates to the BLR 05513 and BLR 05514, both used in conjunction with the BLR 05530. For agreements not fully executed by the February 7, 2023 effective date, the new salary cap of \$86/hour will be in effect.

Electronic Signatures - BLR Forms

On January 23rd, IDOT published Circular Letter 2023-03, stating that all BLR Forms have the capability for electronic signatures. Electronic signatures are optional, not a requirement. As always, it is important to utilize IDOT's website, within the Local Roads "tab" to access the latest version of forms each time a new form is needed. A full list of revised forms can be found within the Circular Letter.

Streamlined Environmental Survey Screening Process

The purpose of this Circular Letter is to announce and inform our Local Public Agency (LPA) and industry partners of significant improvements and changes that are now established to streamline the process of environmental surveys to improve review time. Importantly, this process is structured so the Department remains in full compliance with all Federal and State of Illinois regulations related to natural and cultural resource requirements. Recent Bureau of Design and Environment (BDE) policy changes allow local projects to now be screened for natural and cultural resources by certain qualified and trained Central Office Bureau of Local Roads and Streets (CBLRS) Staff. The intent of the screening process is to also determine which projects must be submitted for more detailed surveys via the BDE Environmental Survey Request (ESR) process efficiently.

2023 Special Programs Assistance Conference (SPAC) Announcement

IDOT and the Special Programs Unit in the Bureau of Programming will be holding informational conferences in each IDOT District this Spring to present 3 (three) grant programs; Economic Development Program (EDP), Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP), and Safe Routes to School Program (SRTS). IDOT staff will be available each day to offer general information about each program and answer your specific questions one-on-one to help you take advantage of the funding opportunities available from these programs.
