2017 RTA Planning Workshop

In partnership with DePaul's Chaddick Institute, the RTA will hold a half-day workshop on transit-oriented planning on Wednesday, March 8, from 8:30 a.m. to noon, at the DePaul Center (1 E. Jackson Blvd., 11th Floor - North Cafe, Chicago).

This year's theme, Making an Impact, focuses on plan implementation, and will feature presentations and discussions from a variety of speakers, including staff from municipal government and transit agencies, as well as private-sector developers. The event will highlight current regional case studies of successful transit-oriented plan implementation that have resulted in benefits such as public infrastructure improvements and transit-oriented development projects. 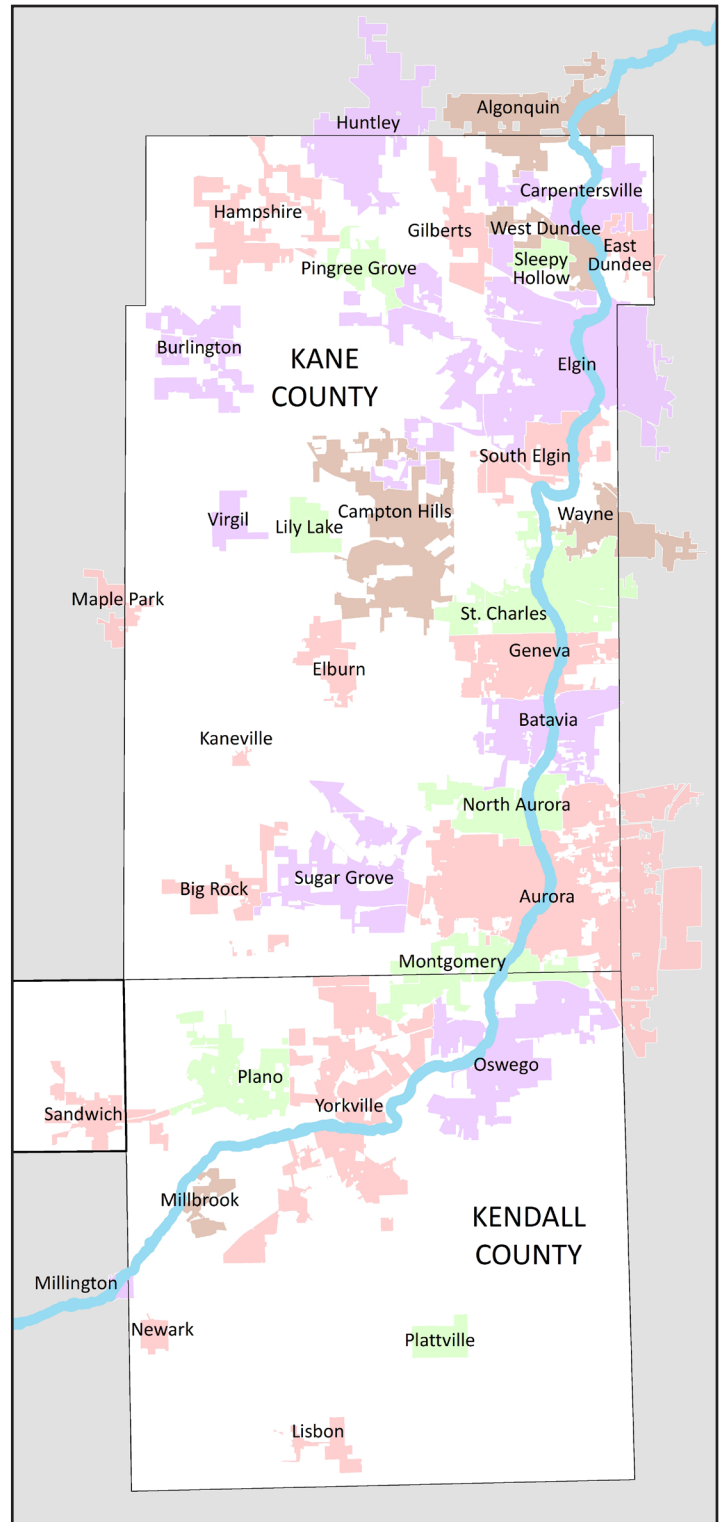
