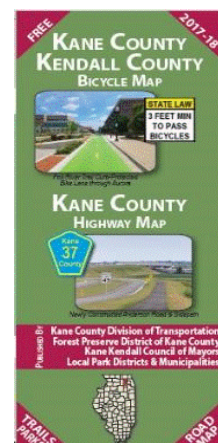
CMAQ Future Leaders in Planning (FLIP) Program

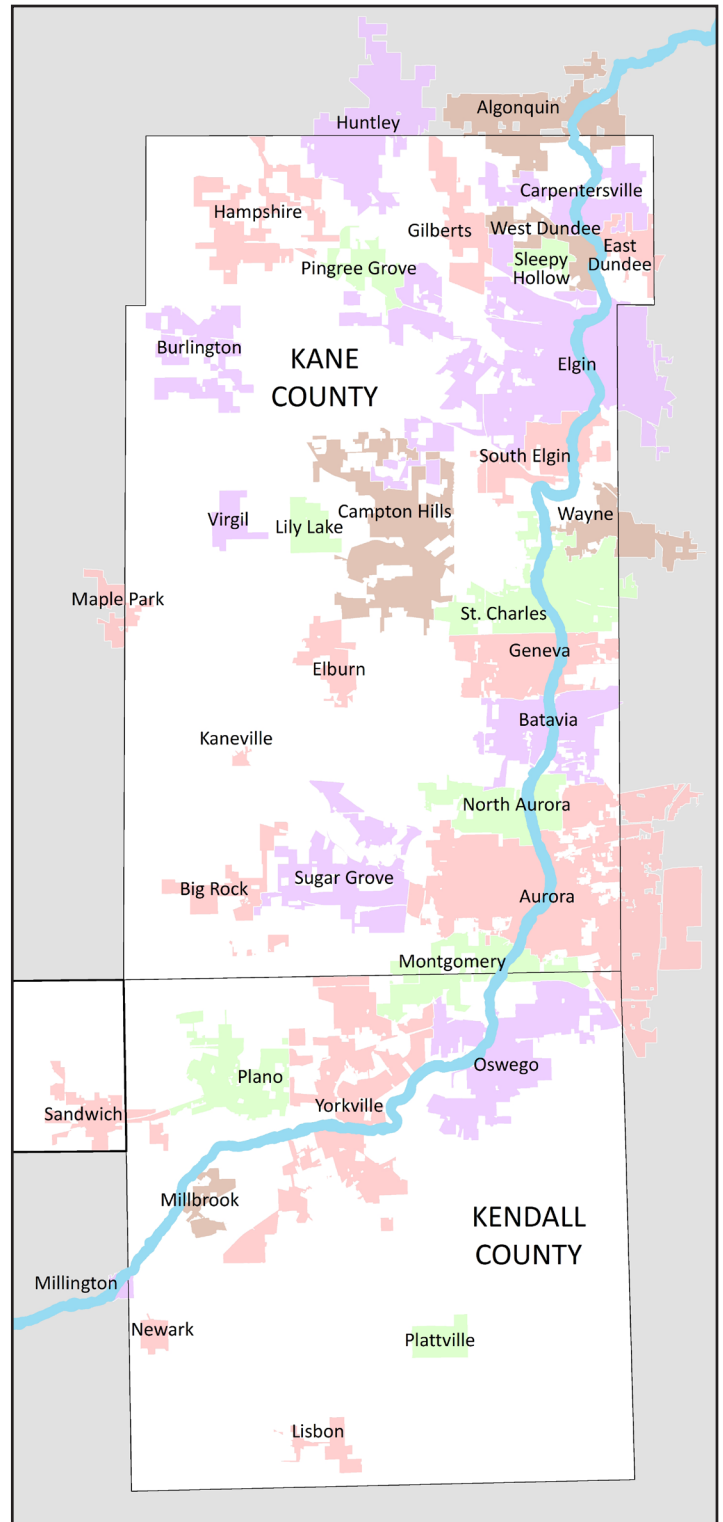
