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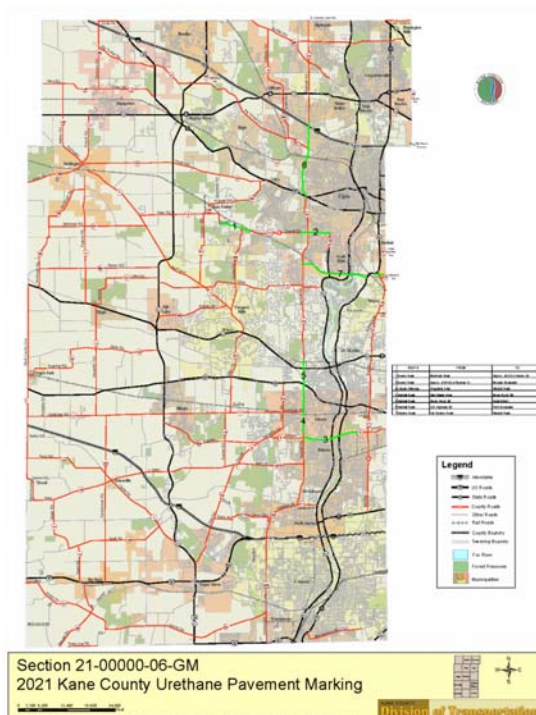
Kane County Pavement Marking Program

July 7, 2021 - The annual Kane County Urethane Pavement Marking Program work will begin the week of July 26, 2021, weather permitting. The work shall include installation of urethane pavement markings onto 18 miles of County highways as indicated on the attached map. The County's typical process is to apply the durable urethane pavement marking to the high volume County highways. This pavement marking project will improve the visibility of the lane markings for the motoring public. The work is anticipated to be completed by the end of October, weather dependent.

The work shall include the following locations:

- Bowes Road from Muirhead Road to Approx. 40 ft. South of Nesler Road
- Bowes Road from Approx. 315 ft. East of Reserve Drive to McLean Boulevard
- Fabyan Parkway from Kingsland Drive to Randall Road
- Randall Road from Glen Eagle Drive to IL Route 38
- Randall Road from IL Route 38 to Dean Street
- Randall Road from US Highway 20 to Point Boulevard
- Stearns Road from Old Stearns Road to Randall Road

Temporary daily lane closures will be required Monday through Saturday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM to safely accomplish this work. Lane closures are scheduled to start in the north end of the county, working their way south until all necessary lane lines have been restriped. The north to south progression may change as weather impacts may dictate alternate striping sequences. Temporary flagger control of intersections will be required in order to safely accomplish the work. Please watch for workers, equipment on the roadway and shoulders, anticipate increased travel times and exercise caution while traveling in freshly painted areas.
