MEETING MINUTES March 1, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 9:01am by Vice Chair Catching and roll call was completed. Upon a motion for approval made by Leigh Tracy, and seconded by Katie Meyer, Jackie Forbes completed a roll call vote and the December 7, 2021 meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

II. REPORTS:

RTA CAB Overview

Jackie Forbes provided an update on the RTA Transit Access Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) from the February 17, 2022 meeting. At this meeting the RTA staff reviewed the new/updated Strategic Plan. The survey is closed, but the RTA staff will continue to work on the Strategic Plan.

RTA staff indicated that the research project to determine if the region should have a Regional Mobility Manager was complete and is being reviewed by the RTA. Six recommendations were made with the most notable being that the RTA should be the host of the Regional Mobility Manager.

RTA has а new online portal called Fare Programs online (Fares.RTAChicago.org). This site is live as of January 18, 2022. This will allow customers to apply for, replace, and renew a RTA Reduced Fare Card or a Ride Free permit. This site will also allow customers to replace a lost ADA Paratransit card, but will not let them apply for a card. To apply for and/or renew an ADA Paratransit card customers have to go through the current ADA paratransit eliaibility process.

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Last, RTA briefed the committee on a pilot program for the ADA certification process once the RTA opens the RTA Mobility Assessment Sites again. This pilot will look to decrease the number of individuals that have to come to an RTA site, by having a hybrid model. Only new customers or customers who have had a significant change in their disability condition or mobility aid will need to have an inperson interview. Those who are renewing their certification and have no significant changes can renew by mail. This pilot will run for approximately 3 months and if successful will be implemented as an ongoing protocol.

Next meeting of the RTA CAB is set for April 25, 2022.

III. OTHER BUSINESS:

A. Kane County/AID Transition

Forbes provided an overview of where things were at with the transition of Kane County assuming the role of administrator of the grants for Ride in Kane. Since the last meeting, the agreement between Pace and Kane County have been approved. The TSA for the JARC and 5310 programs have been approved. The new Title VI program has been sent to the RTA for their approval.

Krystal, Ride in Kane Program Coordinator has been fielding all calls on the information line (630-762-2600). She continues to update the Master list and review all registrations to assure eligibility to the program. Krystal's last day will be May 31st. Kane County is in the process of hiring her replacement.

Forbes explained that Kane County will continue to support all the sponsors through the Kane County subsidy that has been given in the past. There will be no change in that. Kane County will, however, research other potential funding sources for the program.

In January, Kane County began to offer JARC rides for low income residents throughout the County as a sponsor. If you have individuals that are low income that need rides to work, Kane County will register them. Kane County will complete the income verification process and will offer these types of rides until the JARC funds are expended. Current JARC rides will remain the same, but if you have individuals who are low income that you are currently not serving, you can have them contact Kane County. There is approximately \$800,000 in JARC funds left. This will be a slow roll out and rides for individuals with low income needing transportation to work will be the only type of rides Kane County will sponsor for now. Nothing should change for current sponsors.

Kane County has created a new Ride in Kane website. Please review and let us know if we need to make any updates or changes. We hope that it is easier to navigate. The current website address will be automatically directed to the new website. The Rider's Guide has been updated. There is a new logo that is being used.



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B. Election of Officers

Jackie indicated that she had sent out a notice asking for nominations for the officers. She stated she received none. Krystal stated that she had spoken to Trish Glees earlier and that she was not going to be able to attend the meeting. Trish indicated that her consulting business was very busy and she would actually be in flight during the meeting. Given this information, Krystal nominated Bill Catching of Aurora Township for the Chair position. He accepted the nomination and was voted in unanimously. Arin Thrower of Dundee declined the nomination of Vice Chair, but nominated Katie Meyer of Dundee Township. Katie accepted and was unanimously voted in as Vice Chair. Lore Baker was not at the meeting, but was voted to retain her position as Vice Chair.

MEETING MINUTES March 1, 2022

The meeting was called to order at 9:29 a.m. by Bill Catching and roll call from the first meeting was accepted. Forbes quickly reviewed the website with screen shots. Upon a motion for approval made by Ron Johnson, and seconded by Jackie Forbes, Jackie Forbes completed a roll call vote and the December 7, 2021 meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

5310 and JARC Budget Report:

Krystal Spracklen summarized the grant totals for JARC and 5310 funding and how long the funding in each phase will last. She reviewed the cost reports. Krystal asked that if sponsors review the data and see any discrepancies in their numbers to let her know since she has no way of verifying costs for January thru May. The Quarterly reports were reviewed. Krystal pulled all reports back to January 2021 so these numbers are accurate. Trip count is slowly increasing, but is still just barely over 1/2 of what the rides used to be before the pandemic. Trip Mileage mirrors the trips. Average trip remains around 5 miles. Program performance was reviewed. On-Time performance has been corrected now to reflect the 31 minute. Discussed the large drop off in July, not sure what happened. Discussed that late cancel/ no show, which is a rider issue, and missed trips, which is a provider issue, will be reported separately.

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5310 and JARC Budget Report:

Krystal discussed the distinct riders and the registered riders. Registered riders is much harder to get the past numbers without going back and opening every registration to get the date. Going forward, this will be changed to show a row for current registered and a row for new registrations for that month. The data will begin to be reflected in November. It was explained that distinct riders is the actual number of different people that rode. For instance in July 441 different people took 4,332 trips. For the year, 715 individuals utilized Ride in Kane although there are over 8,000 registered to use it.

Registration and Ridership Reports and Customer Complaint Records:

Gary referred to Ridership growth reports, Productivity Data report, and OTP report and led a discussion. The number of trips per month increased each month. Gary reminded us that riders are still required to wear masks while riding at least until March 18, 2022. and also applies to drivers. He indicated that productivity is increasing because multiple riders can ride again instead of just one person per vehicle. Gary noted the on time performance by month and type of ride.

Gary reviewed the complaint and accommodations report for each month (October—December 2021) The breakdown is noted by sponsor by month. Late arrivals was the highest complaint area each month. He emphasized that these are complaints that are actually called in to the customer service number and do not include complaints that were addressed to him. In December the number of complaints did go down. Gary did indicate that any issues that are conveyed to him will be addressed and he will work to correct them. Aurora Township had the most complaints each month, but also had the most rides. Gary encouraged sponsors to inform riders to call the Customer Relations line with their complaints.

Still facing a driver shortage. Gary lists the various openings at the end of the email he sends each week regarding the number of rides for the week. Pace is still prioritizing medical and work trips. Pace is still following the mask mandate. Vehicles are still being sanitized. Pace is transporting multiple riders per vehicle. Pace is transitioning to an automated billing system. This is helping billing being processed faster. They are still working out some kinks. Invoices should however be processed in a more timely manner.

Gary reviewed the DuPage Access Program. It is a program that utilizes Uber. It is a pilot program that began on January 31, 2022. It is a 1 year pilot for a maximum of 1.1 million. Riders who are ADA paratransit certified can ride for free as long as the trip is \$30 or less. They can take 8 trips per day. Passengers can book a trip immediately through Uber app. Reservations by phone can be made through GoGoGrandparent as of yesterday (February 28, 2022). Kisha expanded on this by talking about Ride DuPage also is providing ADA trips for \$5 flat fee up to \$25 trip. These trips are unlimited. Both types of rides can be booked in as little as 15 minutes in advance. Kisha stated that they currently have upwards of 30 people using the Uber program and hopes to see it increase with the phone reservation becoming available.

Gary read a quote from Melinda Metzger "Pace service will not look the same as it did prior to Covid 19 nor should it. Our world has changed and we are changing with it. It is important that we focus on the implementation of innovative programs like this to meet the redefined needs of those we serve."

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Bill Catching also thanked Kisha (Pace) for the Uber gift cards that can be handed out to riders. He thinks that has helped bring the complaints down. Kisha then stated that even though Uber Access program is not in Kane County, the this program is helping Ride in Kane as well because it is freeing up resources that now can be focused on Ride in Kane.

Krystal brought up a phone call she received from a gentleman who currently lives and works in DuPage County, but wants to move to Kane County. He was asking where he could move that would allow him to still work in DuPage County. Bill (Aurora Township) indicated that Aurora works with Ride DuPage to schedule a transfer for those individuals who work right across Route 59.

A motion to adjourn was made by Bill Catching, seconded by Katie Meyer. Voice vote was unanimous. The meeting was adjourned at 10:15 am until June 7, 2022.
